I. INTRODUCTION TO THE DEMAIN SOLIDARITY PROGRAM

1.1 The Origins: Choosing to Act

On January 21, 2018, Morgane Sézalory, founder of the fashion brand Sézane, launched DEMAIN, a solidarity program to support associations in France and worldwide, working concretely to improve access to health, education, culture, and equal opportunity.

By the end of 2024, seven years after its launch, DEMAIN had redistributed €9.7 million to approximately thirty partner organizations and supported nearly 80,000 beneficiaries through more than 500 concrete actions.

1.2 Contributions and Matching Funds

The fashion brands Sézane and Octobre Editions, the primary sponsors of DEMAIN, implement several initiatives throughout the year to support the solidarity program:

The Call of the 21st

On the 21st of each month, all proceeds from a Solidarity Creation and 10% of the day's sales are donated to DEMAIN to support organizations working for children and equal opportunity.

Pink Wednesdays

On the first Wednesday of each month, all proceeds from a Pink Creation, along with 10% of sales from the 'Sézane Denim' line, are donated to the DEMAIN solidarity program and allocated to organizations supporting women's physical and mental health.

Micro-Giving

Customers of Sézane and Octobre can add a microdonation to their purchases, instore or online, to support DEMAIN.

Solidarity Events and Collaborations

Sézane regularly organizes solidarity events and collaborations with artists or friendly brands, donating all proceeds generated to the DEMAIN program.

Skill-Based Volunteering

In addition to direct funding of the program, Sézane and Octobre Editions enable their employees to engage with DEMAIN and its partner organizations during work hours, offering nonfinancial support through their expertise in various fields such as technology, logistics, finance, administration, and communication.

These ongoing and sustainable initiatives reflect the genuine commitment of Sézane and Octobre to a fairer society.

Finally, the DEMAIN solidarity program is authorized to appeal to public generosity and, as such, can also receive unrestricted donations and bequests from private contributors via its website donation form.

1.3 Governance and Program Operations

DEMAIN supports associations that ensure children's access to their fundamental rights and work to improve women's physical and mental health. By funding innovative initiatives capable of addressing present and future challenges, DEMAIN is committed to reducing inequalities, promoting equitable access to resources, opportunities, and healthcare, and building a fairer and more inclusive society. The DEMAIN solidarity program is composed of several entities.

1.3.1 A Transparent & Independent French Endowment Fund

A board of directors made up of volunteer members who meet several times a year to define the fund's strategy and major orientations. It includes:

- Ms. Morgane SÉZALORY, President.
- Mr. Sébastien ESCUDERO, Vice President and Treasurer.
- Mr. Majide BELKACEM, Board member.

An Investment Advisory Committee that provides guidance on financial decisions and defines funding priorities. Composed of seven volunteer experts from the philanthropic, nonprofit, foundation, and civil society sectors, this committee enhances perspectives and strengthens the program's impact. Meeting once a year, it provides essential external insight.

A salaried general director is responsible for managing the solidarity program, selecting associations, allocating funds, monitoring, and measuring impact. The management team regularly convenes partner organizations to review fund allocations and assess supported actions.

DEMAIN's annual accounts are prepared by an accounting firm (ENDRIX) and certified by an auditor (MAZARS).

1.3.2 Two *Donor Advised Funds* in the US and the UK

These two funds are hosted by *Charities* Aid Foundation (CAF), a charitable organization operating in the United Kingdom, the United States, and Canada. As an expert in philanthropy, CAF provides fund management services and advisory support to donors and charitable organizations. This structure enables DEMAIN to support American and British associations working in fields such as health, education, and more. This collaboration ensures efficient and transparent distribution of funds toward critical causes, thereby strengthening the impact of the DEMAIN solidarity program on an international scale.

In the US, DEMAIN operates as a *Donor Advised Fund* administered by CAF America, an American organization registered under EIN 43-1634280.

In the UK, DEMAIN is a *Donor Advised Fund* administered by CAF, a British organization registered under number 268369.

This structure reflects our ongoing commitment to transparency, independence, operational efficiency, and the involvement of diverse stakeholders in the governance of the DEMAIN program.

1.3.3 DEMAIN's Selection and Allocation Criteria

Each association is rigorously selected based on several criteria:

- Area(s) of intervention,
- Operations,
- Governance,
- Financial health,
- Impact measurement(s).

In our selection process, we encourage transparency and collaboration, fostering exchanges with both association leaders and field operators to stay as close as possible to the realities of the teams and beneficiaries. We also pay particular attention to innovative structures, their understanding of DEMAIN's mission, and their ability to address future challenges.

DEMAIN has established several general allocation rules that, while flexible, guide its actions, including:

- Long-term support. Projects focused on children and equal opportunity require long-term efforts to create systemic change. That is why we commit to our partner associations over time. Some of our longest-standing partnerships are automatically renewable with no set expiration date.
- Significant funding for a limited number of partners. To ensure a privileged relationship is maintained with each association, DEMAIN has

chosen to work with a limited number of partners and provide them with substantial resources. The average donation in 2024 was approximately €145,000. Each year, priority is given to existing partners to strengthen their allocated support and help them grow sustainably.

- Controlled dependency risk.

 The amount granted by DEMAIN does not exceed 20% of the association's annual budget.
- Unrestricted funds. While all partner associations undergo rigorous audits, DEMAIN ensures they have full flexibility to allocate funds according to their needs. This allows them to sustain ongoing projects, innovate with experimental initiatives, or respond to unexpected challenges. However, unrestricted funding does not eliminate the need for reporting. DEMAIN systematically requests from supported organizations:
 - Seforehand, how they intend to use the funds and how this will meet their objectives for the final beneficiaries.
 - Afterward, how the funds were utilized, the concrete actions carried out, and the achieved results.


II. 2024 REPORT & İMPACT

2.1. Promise Kept: Growing Impact

Since its inception, DEMAIN has been committed to ensuring access to essential needs such as health, education, culture, and leisure. With € 9.7M redistributed since 2018, the program has impacted over 80,000 beneficiaries in France and abroad, thanks to 540 concrete initiatives led by approximately thirty partner organizations.









In 2024 alone, €3,155,734 was allocated to 22 partner organizations, supporting 125 projects and benefiting 34,127 people.


2.2. Allocation of Funds in 2024

The fund distribution, illustrated in the accompanying graphic, highlights the program's priorities:

- Fields of intervention: Health, fundamental rights, education, and recreation.
- **Project types**: Operations and coordination, construction and infrastructure, as well as emergency actions.

This review reflects DEMAIN's ongoing commitment to maximizing its impact and responding effectively to the needs expressed by beneficiaries and partner organizations.

2.3. Childhood and Equal Opportunity

Every child deserves to discover the world, learn at their own pace, and dream without limits. Supporting education and equal opportunity means building the foundations of a better tomorrow, today, alongside field partners.

With **70% of allocated funds**—amounting to €2,235,130 in 2024—directed toward associations committed to children's fundamental rights, DEMAIN reaffirms its goal of ensuring equitable access to educational and cultural opportunities.

Key areas of intervention include:

- Education: Enabling all children to learn and grow in environments that foster their development.
- **Culture and recreation:** Opening new horizons through enriching activities that nurture creativity and critical thinking.
- Access to healthcare: Ensuring every child has optimal health to support their well-being.
- Building self-confidence: Helping each child feel they belong and find their place.

These initiatives demonstrate the significant impact of DEMAIN in empowering children to achieve their dreams and envision a brighter future.

2.4. Supporting Our Key Partners



La Voix de l'Enfant is a federation dedicated to listening to and defending children in distress, wherever they may be. For over 40 years, its president, Martine Brousse, has worked to improve the daily lives of vulnerable children through local initiatives.

Situation: One in five children in France lives below the poverty line and struggles to access fundamental rights.

DEMAIN Support in 2024: *€523,000*

Key Achievements:

In 2024, DEMAIN supported 41 member associations, reaching more than 15,000 beneficiaries in France and globally. Some examples of funded projects include:

- Educational and Social Support:
 Providing informal schooling for
 Afghan girls denied access to education
 and offering online training for teachers
 working in informal classes,
 in partnership with *Afrane*.
- Raising Awareness of Fundamental Rights: Financing 100 educational workshops in schools and after-school programs to promote children's rights

and combat violence (abuse, bullying, cyberviolence, and online child exploitation) through the association *Cameleon*.

• Healthcare Access:

Funding 170 musical interventions across seven hospitals in the South of France, helping to alleviate the physical and psychological suffering of 676 hospitalized children, led by the association PHONAMBULE.

- Leisure and Vacation Activities: Supporting cultural and recreational outings, including circus and theater performances, laser game activities, visits to La Tête dans les Nuages play space and libraries, as well as soccer, ecology, and IT workshops organized by L'Académie de Football Paris 18 (AFP18).
- Emergency Relief: Responding to humanitarian crises, including assistance in Vietnam during Typhoon Yagi in collaboration with *Sourires d'Enfants* and in Lebanon through partners such as *Service de l'Enfant au Foyer (SEF)*, ACAPEL, and SESOBEL.

Bibliothèques Sans Frontières Libraries Without Borders Bibliothèques Sans Frontières

Since 2007, Libraries Without Borders has promoted access to culture and quality education for disadvantaged children and young people in France and abroad.

Situation: About 15% of students in France, particularly non-native speakers and those in precarious situations, struggle to access suitable educational resources.

DEMAIN Support in 2024: *€158,800*

Key Achievements:

- **Micro-libraries:** 104 micro-libraries deployed across metropolitan France and overseas territories (DROM-COM).
- My Book Bag: Over 15,000 book bags distributed to 3,200 newly arrived children enrolled in French schools.

The @thletes of Information: Raising awareness among young people (300 participants in six months) on media literacy, misinformation, and fact-checking, with a particular focus on girls.

Sport dans la Ville promotes social and professional inclusion for young people from priority neighborhoods through sports.

Situation: Girls aged 11 to 14 participate in sports half as much as boys. Among them, 40% report lacking self-confidence, and 74% do not consider careers in technical or scientific fields.

DEMAIN support in 2024: *€400,000*

Key Achievments:

• In 2024, the association expanded its impact by opening a new campus in Île-de-France, now supporting 3,000 young people with a dedicated space for education through sports.

Specially designed for young girls, the *L dans la Ville* program enhances access to sports, builds self-confidence, and helps participants integrate into the professional world. This program breaks gender stereotypes and promotes inclusivity.

Impact: Thanks to *L dans la Ville*, 2 530 young girls participated in 2024. Among them:

- 80% practice sports at least once a week.
- 73% feel better about their bodies.
- 85% of former participants are now employed or in training.

2.5. Women's Health

In 2024, DEMAIN dedicated 30% of its funds, totaling €920,578 to supporting vulnerable women, helping them overcome challenges with dignity and resilience. This commitment focuses on two main areas.


2.5.1. The Fight Against Breast Cancer

Alongside key stakeholders, DEMAIN is actively working to advance breast cancer research with several priorities:

- Advancing fundamental research to better understand the disease and develop innovative treatments.
- Raising public awareness of the importance of early detection.
- Improving patient care through tailored treatment programs.

SEZANE AND DEMAIN COMMIT TO MEDICAL RESEARCH

Since 2018, more than €2M has been allocated to four key organizations



2.5.1.1. Alongside Our Key Partners

These initiatives are carried out in collaboration with three leading institutions:



Gustave Roussy is Europe's leading cancer research institute, combining patient care, research, and education. A multidisciplinary team, including oncologists, project managers, and researchers, supports these clinical trials.

Situation: Breast cancer affects one in eight women in France and is the most common cancer among women. Nearly 90% of those diagnosed survive. Among its types, triple-negative breast cancer represents about 15% of cases, characterized by greater aggressiveness and limited treatment options.

DEMAIN Support in 2024: *€150,000*

Key Achievements: DEMAIN contributed to the development of the COMPASS-TNBC program, dedicated to evaluating therapeutic strategies for patients with metastatic triple-negative breast cancer.

- Funding salaries for researchers, clinical project managers, and oncologists involved in developing new treatment protocols.
- Inclusion of three patients in the COMPASS-TNBC program.

The women's cancer research found (WCRF), a program of The Breast Cancer Research Foundation (BCRF)

The Women's Cancer Research Fund supports breast cancer prevention and research by funding innovative studies.

Situation: Breast cancer is the most common cancer among women worldwide, with 2.3 million new cases and approximately 670,000 deaths in 2022 (source: WHO). These numbers highlight the importance of early detection, prevention, and access to treatment.

DEMAIN Support in 2024: *€369,909*

Key Achievements:


In 2024, *The Women's Cancer Research Fund* financed 275 researchers and published 17 studies.

- Targeted treatments: New tests and medications improve treatment for complex breast cancer forms, such as HER2-positive and triple-negative cases.
- Innovated diagnostics: Researchers are developing a new liquid biopsy technique to detect cancer at all stages with a simple blood test.
- New medications: A treatment is in development for metastatic breast cancers with specific genetic mutations, providing new options for patients.

Impact: Breast cancer-related deaths have decreased by 40% due to advancements in research. HER2-positive breast cancer, representing 20% of cases, has particularly benefited from groundbreaking treatments in recent years.

Pink ribbon The Pink Ribbon Foundation

The organization supports breast cancer prevention and treatment through grants to projects in the United Kingdom and underprivileged European countries.

DEMAIN Support in 2024: *€240,669*

Key Achievements:

- Strengthened educational campaigns to raise awareness about screening and prevention.
- Funded 70 projects in the UK and 25 projects in 15 European countries, including:
 - Care kits for women undergoing breast cancer treatment.
 - Specialist counseling for hair loss.
 - Various therapies such as reflexology and massage.
 - Shreast cancer awareness campaigns targeting underserved groups.
 - > Nutritional guidance for patients undergoing treatment.

2.5.2. Combating Violence Against Women

In addition, DEMAIN is committed to fighting violence against women, particularly domestic violence, in collaboration with the *Fédération Nationale Solidarité Femmes*, which supports and protects victims daily.

In 2024, over 3,000 emergency or permanent shelter places were provided for vulnerable women, representing 50% of the available spaces for female victims of violence in France.

2.5.3. Alongside Our Key Partner



The Fédération Nationale Solidarité Femmes (FNSF) fights against violence against women and their children by providing listening services, shelter, and support toward autonomy.

Situation:

- 99% of callers to the 3919 helpline are women.
- 21,000 children are victims of domestic violence each year in France.
- The number of calls has doubled in three years.

DEMAIN Support in 2024: *€150,000*

Key Achievements:

- Emergency shelter for women victims of violence and their children.
- Advocacy and exhibitions on the impact of domestic violence on children.
- Collection and dissemination of survivor testimonies to build a collective memory.

2.6. All Our Other Partners



Mission: Provide free music education to children aged 7 to 12 from priority neighborhoods or rural areas.

Situation: Children from priority neighborhoods and isolated rural areas face economic, social, and geographic barriers to accessing music education.

DEMAIN Support in 2024: *€150,000*

Key Achievements:

- In 2024, 45 Démos orchestras were active in France, including 13 in rural areas. Two new orchestras were created.
- Six orchestras were awarded the Démos Network label, gaining greater autonomy.
- International collaborations strengthened the exchange of musical practices, notably with Brazil and Cameroon.

Impact: Since 2010, over **12,000** young people have benefited from the Démos program, improving concentration, discipline, and self-confidence through music. **50%** continue practicing an instrument after the program.

Mission: Supporting young women in difficulty to strengthen their autonomy and professional confidence.

Situation: In 2024, 53% of young women in England and Wales reported experiencing workplace discrimination - a record high. Additionally, only 63% of young women feel optimistic about their professional future, compared to 70% of young men, and 64% say their hopes for the future have declined over the past year. Among the young women supported by the organization, 45% report mental health issues, and 15% experience domestic violence.

DEMAIN support in 2024: *€197,873*

Key Achievements:

Since April 2024, *Young Women's Trust* has supported 2282 young women, including 1,639 through one-on-one coaching sessions and 1,384 through personalized CV support. The pilot program *Power Hours* has also helped 176 participants build professional networks and develop practical skills.

Impact in 2024:

- 64% found a job or training opportunity through the program.
- 62% improved their self-confidence.

Mission: Provide psychological, social, and legal assistance to children and adolescents in danger.

Situation: In 2024, 43% of cases handled involved mental health issues, with a rise in suicidal behaviors.

DEMAIN Support in 2024: *€50,000*

Key Achievements: Strengthening the resources allocated to Spain's free national child protection helpline.

Impact in 2024:

- 250,000 requests for help processed between January and October 2024.
- 5,700 emergency interventions to protect children in critical situations.

Deutsches Kinderhilfswerk The German Children's Found

Mission: Supporting children in Germany facing extreme poverty by providing inclusive and safe educational spaces through Kinderhaus after-school care centers (Kinderhaus).

Observation: In Germany, 2.1 million children—14% of those under 18—are at risk of poverty. Children from disadvantaged backgrounds have limited access to educational, artistic, and social opportunities.

DEMAIN support in 2024: €150,000

Key achievements:

- Access to safe spaces for vulnerable **children:** 13 children's homes provided refuge and support to approximately 10,000 children across Germany, including 2,174 directly supported by DEMAIN.
- Educational and artistic projects: Initiatives such as the annual theater project, which involved 40 participants aged 6 to 57, helped children develop

- expression and collaboration skills. All performances were fully booked.
- **National recognition:** The Retterherzen project won the KIKA Award in the "Engagement" category, highlighting the impact of children's homes in fostering social cohesion.
- Strengthening children's rights: Initiatives like the launch of a children's rights poster for nurseries and an illustrated educational video have raised awareness among children and educators about the rights outlined in the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child.

Impact: Nearly 70,000 children benefited from Kinderhaus activities in 2024, fostering autonomy and confidence.

Mission: Support children and young adults with autism through adapted structures, educational programs, and training to promote inclusion and well-being.

Situation: 700,000 people in France have autism spectrum disorders, including 100,000 under 20 years old.

DEMAIN Support in 2024: *€63,211*

Key Achievements: Development of adapted facilities and production of online training for parents and caregivers.

Impact in 2024:

- 340 children, adolescents, and young adults supported across 30 specialized institutions.
- 240 professionals trained to improve care quality and foster inclusion.

2.7. DEMAIN in France and Internationally



Since its creation, DEMAIN has expanded its solidarity efforts internationally. Each partner association works closely within its community to meet local needs. Projects funded in Asia and Africa are systematically coordinated with *La Voix de l'Enfant (LVDE)*, a nationally recognized federation known for its role as a trusted intermediary. *LVDE* facilitates the implementation of initiatives in collaboration with local associations, ensuring an indepth understanding of on-the-ground realities and effective cooperation with regional stakeholders. This approach guarantees the relevance, sustainability, and impact of each action, ensuring that the support provided truly benefits the populations concerned.

2.8. Key Events of 2024

The year 2024 was marked by inspiring events in support of the DEMAIN solidarity program.

Martin Le Pape: A Skipper Committed to a Better Future

One of the key initiatives of the DEMAIN program was the partnership with Martin Le Pape, a renowned French sailor.

Thanks to this partnership, young people from the association *La Voix de l'Enfant* discovered the maritime world and had their first sailing experience alongside Martin. This immersive journey, combining sport and adventure, gave them an unforgettable experience, bringing to life the impact of DEMAIN's actions.

By proudly wearing DEMAIN's colors during his races, Martin also provided valuable visibility for the program, while carrying a strong message of solidarity and commitment throughout his competitions.







The DEMAIN Live Magazine: A Must-Attend Event

Among the year's highlights, the DEMAIN *Live Magazine* became a highly anticipated solidarity gathering. Hosted in prestigious venues such as the *Théâtre des Champs-Élysées*, this unique event blends journalism, personal testimonies, and artistic performances to raise public awareness of social issues and encourage reflection on major causes.

Two editions were offered: one for children (ages 7-12), featuring playful, creative, and interactive stories, and another for adults, addressing key themes supported by DEMAIN, such as equal opportunities and the fight against violence against women.





Thanks to Sézane, DEMAIN's main patron, who covered the event's organization and donated all proceeds, the *Live Magazine* gathered over 3,000 spectators and allowed 220 beneficiaries both adults and children from partner associations to take part in this meaningful experience.



2.9. The Engagement of SEZANE and OCTOBRE Employees: At the Heart of DEMAIN's Growth

The commitment of the Sézane and Octobre teams is the driving force behind the growth and success of DEMAIN. More than just support, their involvement translates into volunteer work and skills-based volunteering, providing expertise in communication, finance, legal matters, design, logistics, and development to benefit the DEMAIN program.

In 2024, more than **220 Sézane and Octobre employees** participated in solidarity projects, contributing nearly **1,000 hours** of engagement.

This collective effort has amplified the impact of DEMAIN's initiatives across numerous partner associations.

A Commitment in Many Forms:

- Creation of Solidarity Products:
 On the 1st Wednesday and the 21st of each month, unique products are designed, crafted, and sold, leveraging the expertise and skills of the teams.
 The goal is to support essential causes and ensure the sustainability of fundraising efforts.
- Skills-Based Volunteering: Various missions have been carried out to meet the concrete needs of partner associations: decorating a sailboat to help children experience sailing, redesigning the premises of *Agir et Vivre l'Autisme*, creating murals in a children's hospital, and revamping communication materials to professionalize partner organizations.

- Solidarity Workshops: These moments of exchange and collaboration have enabled the realization of local actions, such as hosting interns to promote equal opportunities, sorting books for *Bibliothèques Sans Frontières*, and removing labels from clothing to redistribute them to nonprofits.
- Unifying Events: From Live Magazine and participation in sporting events like the Odyssea Race to the football tournament organized by Sport dans la Ville at Clairefontaine, these gatherings have strengthened bonds while raising awareness among employees about the key causes supported by the DEMAIN program.

Product Donations:

In 2024, DEMAIN shipped **267 boxes** of Sézane and Octobre products (clothing, books, gifts, etc.), totaling **4,104 kg**, to around fifteen beneficiary associations. These donations directly supported women in vulnerable situations, people facing extreme hardship, and Parisian hospitals.

Thanks to these contributions, the associations were able to provide concrete and immediate assistance to those most in need, further strengthening their impact on a daily basis.

- Internships for Exploration and Growth: Sézane and Octobre will welcome young people from DEMAIN's partner organizations to introduce them to a wide range of professions. Designed by in-house teams, this high-quality internship program offers full immersion in various fields, including design, production, quality, photography, marketing, communication, finance, and logistics. A true stepping stone to broaden their professional horizons.
- A Tailor-Made Workshop for Women Survivors of Violence: In January, a "Self-Image" day will be organized by the Image and Human Resources teams in partnership with the Flora Tristan center. The event will include beauty sessions, wardrobe advice, a professional photoshoot, and an HR workshop to support women on their path to professional reintegration.
- Empowering Young Women:
 In February, the Communication team will host a workshop for young girls from Sport dans la Ville, helping them build confidence and develop their potential in a professional setting.
- Bringing Children's Dreams to
 Life on Stage: The Petit Sézane team
 will support a nonprofit dedicated to
 underprivileged children by designing
 costumes, allowing them to take the
 stage and turn their dreams into reality.

And this is just the beginning—many more solidarity projects will take shape throughout the year with DEMAIN!

3.3. Expanding the Scope of DEMAIN's International Outreach

Strengthened by international partnerships established in 2024, the DEMAIN solidarity program aims to further extend its global reach.
